Donor Bill of Rights

Adopted from the Association of Fundraising Professionals

Giving to Brant United Way is a voluntary action taken by members of the community for the common good. We strive to ensure our donors are treated with respect and appreciation. It is essential that donors and prospective donors can have full confidence their gift will be used in the manner in which it was intended to be used.

As a donor, you have the right:

- To be informed of Brant United Way's mission and the process that will be followed to use the resources that are donated.
- To know who is leading the organization, whether as members of the Board of Directors, Campaign Cabinet or senior staff, and to expect they will behave responsibly and as effective stewards in our community.
- To have access to the organization's most recent financial statements.
- To be assured their gifts will be used for the purposes for which they were given.
- To receive appropriate acknowledgement and recognition.
- To have your personal information about yourself and/or your donation be handled with respect and with confidentiality to the extent provided by law.
- To be treated professionally, courteously and with respect by individuals representing Brant United Way.
- To be informed whether those seeking donations are volunteers, employees of the organization or hired solicitors.
- To have the opportunity for their names to be deleted from mailing lists that an organization may intend to share.
- To feel free to ask questions when making a donation and to receive prompt, truthful and forthright answers.
